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1 And the only thing I can think of right now,
2 I'm not changing custody, but I'm going to enter an
3 order that both of you have parental controls on your
4 internet -- on your internet at home so that the
5 children cannot access anything other than -- I don't
6 know the mechanics of how it works, but essentially
7 the kids should have access to the internet for
8 school purposes. You are correct. The kids use
9 Google Chrome, they should be able to use their math
10 programs, reading programs, but that's the extent.
11 So, I'm going to enter that order that you both have
12 parental controls on internet access, that you both
13 supervise the internet access of the children when
14 they are at home. That the children -- you -- and
15 correct me if I'm wrong, Attorney Brigham. Are there
16 specific orders with regard to providing the other
17 parent information with regard to vacation?

18 MS. BRIGHAM: I believe there are, Your Honor.

19 THE COURT: All right. So I'm going to enter an
20 order. If it's not there, I'm going to enter an
21 order that you both, when taking vacation, provide
22 each other with notice as to where you are going,
23 where you are staying, contact information, and that
24 the other person can have daily contact with the
25 children.

26 These children are not to speak or to meet
27 anybody by the name of Paul Boyne. All right. And

1 I'm going to make that very clear.

2 MS. GROHS: Your Honor, may I ask you a
3 question? Attorney Brigham had pointed out Netflix.
4 My children do have Netflix. They have children's
5 Netflix account.

6 THE COURT: I don't. I'm not posting that.
7 Because yeah, there are parental controls on that, so
8 that it's age appropriate. So, provided they have
9 internet to the -- they have access to the internet,
10 as long as it's age appropriate. I mean, the
11 internet is a fact of life. Kids use it for school.

12 But we need -- you need, to monitor what these
13 children access on the internet. And the stuff that
14 was introduced today is clearly inappropriate for the
15 children to access. There is no question about that.
16 They shouldn't be accessing that. They shouldn't be
17 seeing it.

18 And to the extent -- you know, I'm not going to
19 enter an order that's impossible to monitor, but to
20 the extent that you have control over what gets
21 disseminated, and who gets it, and what they do with
22 it, you know, the goal may be to harm the other
23 person but, again, at the end of day, we are here not
24 because we are trying to figure out what's in Miss
25 Grohs' best interest or Mr. Grohs', it's about these
26 children, and that can never -- we can't lose sight
27 of that. And this stuff hurts those children,
